July 9-14th, 2017(PLEASE READ THIS ENTIRELY SO THAT YOU DO NOT MISS ANY INFORMATION)

SCHEDULE

Zona Camp is July 9-14 and is located at Northern Arizona University. We will meet at Calvary's McCulloch campus (1605 McCulloch Blvd) at 11:30am on Sunday, July 10th to leave. Do not be late. If your student is not present and loaded at the time of departure, they will be left behind! We will arrive back at Calvary's Parking Lot around lunch time on Friday the 14th.

MONEY

Cost for Zona Camp 2015 is \$350 (all payments are non-refundable) with a deposit of \$100 due on May 1st. Feel free to make multiple payments at your convenience. Final payment is due Sunday, July 2nd. You can signup or pay at any point, but if you sign up after May 31st, we ask that you pay in full when signing up. Students will need not need money for meals as in previous years. Please make sure your student eats lunch the day that we leave. Extra money for snacks and souvenirs is at the parents' discretion. The camp also collects a donation for a chosen charity. We highly encourage your student bring money for this!!!

All signups are FINAL after May 31st! If you drop out after this date you still owe the full payment or must find someone to replace your spot at camp! If you sign up after this date you must pay in full upon completion of registration!

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Lack of funds IS NOT a reason to not attend camp! Financial assistance is available, but the student must be willing to participate in fundraisers to qualify. Talk to Robert about assistance opportunities. Please do not apply for assistance if you don't need it!

MANDATORY PARENT MEETINGS

Parents of EVERY student that wants to attend camp must have a meeting with Robert. This is mandatory, no exceptions will be made.

Two meetings are planned, and parents must attend only one. Guidelines/Rules for the camp will addressed, and forms (medical release, etc) for the camp will be filled out at this meeting, so please have all relevant documents (insurance cards, etc) and information (allergies, list of medications, physician's name/phone, etc) with you at the meeting. The dates for those meetings are Wednesday June 21st and Wednesday July 5th. Both will be at 8:00pm at the Sweetwater campus aft our weekly student night.

EXPERIENCE CHOICES

Zona Camp has four Experiences for students to choose from. Below are the Experiences to choose from (you MUST choose one).

- ZONA EXPERIENCE: ZONA experience is a high energy opportunity where students will enjoy small group bible studies mixed with a wide variety of classes and activities that they choose.
- IMPACT: IMPACT is a brand new Experience designed for students wanting to take it to the "next level". IMPACT focuses on worldview and leadership development. This is great for student leaders, or those who have attended Zona before.

- WORSHIP CATALYST: Worship Catalyst meets the unique needs of musicians, singers, actors and technologists helping them become great worship leaders. You can choose from acoustic guitar, bass guitar, electric guitar, keys, drums, vocals, drama, or tech). Prior experience is necessary for instrumentalists.
- <u>MISSION LIFE</u>: Mission life is an on and off-campus mission experience for those students looking for a hands-on experience to serve others.

DRESS CODE

Since this is a Christian youth camp, we ask all campers/leaders to dress with this in mind. The following is the camp's dress code policy:

- Shirts: Undergarments are not displayed. Cover the wearer's midriff and, for females, the chest/bust area as well. All garments must cover or be covered by the wearer's waist band while standing. No tube tops or spaghetti straps are allowed. Tank tops may be worn but straps must be two inches wide or wider.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses are at a length that will allow the wearer's finger tips to touch the garment when arms and hands are fully extended, while standing.
- Swim suits Females: swimwear must be a one-piece suit (no tankinis). T-shirts are not to be worn over swimwear. Males: swimwear must be boxer style suits with at least a 5 inch inseam & a nylon or mesh liner
- Lewd clothing and clothing which undesirable material is not allowed.

WHAT TO PACK

- Bible, notebook, pencil
- Sleeping bag or twin sheets and pillow
- Towels and toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothbrush, etc.)
- Clothes for 6 days keeping in mind there will be time for worship, games, sports, etc.
- Close-toed shoes and work clothes and gloves if participating in Mission Track
- Swim suits see above for guidelines
- Extra spending money for food at camp, souvenirs, and camp donation
- *Cell Phone (optional)

DON'T PACK THESE

- **Undesirable literature, Weapons, Knives, Illegal Drugs, Tobacco, Alcohol (immediately sent home for these)
- Water balloons, fireworks, matches/lighters, shaving cream (except for shaving), or Hair Dye
- Laptops, external speakers, DVD players

POLICIES

As mentioned in the previous sections, a student may be sent home <u>at the parent's expense</u> for: breaking the rules, disrespect toward any leader, or other unruly behavior.

Due to space limitations each camper will be limited to **One suitcase and One carry-on.**

- *Students will be allowed to bring their cell phones with them this year, but they are not to be used anytime other than free time! If your student is caught using them at unauthorized times, they will be taken up and not returned until we return to Calvary's parking lot.
- **If any camper is found with one of these items he/she will be sent home at their parent's expense.
- ***CBC, ZYC, and NAU are not responsible for any lost/stolen/broken items or money. Your student may bring the items mentioned, but they are responsible for their safe-keeping.
